



EASTER JOINING INSTRUCTIONS

1. WHERE IS THE COURSE BEING HELD?

Weeks 1 and 2 are being held at St Edward's School, Woodstock Road, Oxford, OX2 7NN.
Week 3 tuition is being held at Oxford Sixth Form College, 12-13 King Edward Street, Oxford, OX1 4HT with accommodation held at their boarding location of 28-31 St Ebbes Street, Oxford, OX1 1PU.

Note: Week 3 is located in the city centre, direct access and parking are therefore extremely limited – there is no parking directly available to us nor a drop of location outside of the tuition or accommodation location. Travelling by car into the city centre is strictly controlled and enforced and it is highly advised to check your route and source alternative travel or nearby parking to make the final part of the journey by bus or on foot.

2. WHAT TIME SHOULD I ARRIVE?

Students should arrive between the times indicated below:

Sunday Arrivals:

Residential Students – 5pm to 7pm *only if you have booked accommodation for this night*

Note: Week 3 students are to arrive to the accommodation location of St Ebbes Street.

Monday Arrivals – Week 1 & 2

Residential Students – 9am to 10.30am

Day Only Students – 10am to 10.30am

Monday Arrivals – Week 3

All Students – 10am to 10.30am

Note: Week 3 students are to arrive to the tuition location on King Edward Street.

Tuesday to Friday – All Weeks

Day Only Students should arrive for 8.55am

3. WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I ARRIVE?

Upon arrival to St Edward's School and Oxford Sixth Form College please follow the white swing signs to the Course Office, where a member of the Oxford Science Studies team will greet you. Arrivals can be particularly busy, if no staff member is available to assist you please wait and we will be with you as soon as possible. If it is your first week, we will provide you with your course folder, this will include your timetable for the week along with important course details, such as the course rules and a campus map. We will go through your folder with you so this is your opportunity to double check your allocated classes and ask any questions you might have. If you are a residential student for Weeks 1 and 2, we will take you to your boarding house and room, so that you can get settled. If you are a residential student for Week 3, we will store your luggage and take you to your boarding house later on in the day. The Course Introduction, ice breaker and campus tour will take place on Monday morning, following arrivals. Lessons will begin after lunch. For the following days you are to sign in at 'Registration and Study Skills' as denoted on your timetable. Please ensure that you arrive on time, at 8.55am.



4. WHAT TIME WILL I FINISH?

Students should depart between the times indicated below:

Monday to Thursday:

Day Only Students – 5pm

Friday:

All Students – 4.30pm to 4.45pm

Saturday:

You will need to vacate your room by 9am.

All students will need to vacate their rooms by 8.30am on Friday, the last day of the course, luggage will be stored at the tuition location until your departure later that afternoon.

Some residential students may need to leave earlier to catch a flight. Sadly, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to reschedule lessons and a refund will not be available for any time missed. If a student does need to depart early, please do let us know.

Residential students staying the weekend between Week 2 to Week 3 will move location on the Friday.
